

## **DAVV CET** **June 09, 2010**

The CET was held on 09 June, 2010 at various cities across India.

There was no surprise element as the pattern was already declared in the brochure and the test was on traditional lines. There were a total **75 questions** to be solved in a time span of **90 minutes. There were five sections viz. Language, Quantitative Aptitude (QA), Logical Reasoning and general intelligence, Data Interpretation and General Knowledge (GK)** containing **15 questions** each.

It was given in the instructions that each correct answer will carry three marks, while there was a negative marking of 1 mark for each incorrect answer.

There was no sectional time limit.

**Total Number of Questions** – 75

**Total Time** – 90 minutes

**The Marking Scheme** – 3 marks for each correct answer and – 1 mark for each incorrect answer.

**Number of Options** – 5

**Sections/Sectional Time Limit** – There were 5 sections with no sectional time limit.

# **Detailed Analysis**

**Overall level of difficulty of the paper can be rated as easy to moderate.** Fifteen questions were in each section. There were total five sections which included 75 questions.

## **Section I - Quantitative Aptitude (QA)**

The questions included from the topics like Number System, Functions, Set Theory, Matrices, Compound Interest, Probability, Profit and Loss, Discount.

## **Section II - Logical Reasoning and General Intelligence**

The questions were from Number Series, Alphabets Series, Word Analogy, Number Analogy.

## **Section III - Language**

There were total fifteen questions which included five questions of antonyms of the word like erasure, countermand etc. Five questions from locating the collective noun of the word given in the question which included word like agreement, school girls, tunes, aeroplanes, kangroos. Five questions were of defining the idiom given in the question, some of the idiom were to burn ones finger, not fit to old candle, to keep an ace of, etc. The questions were of the easy difficulty level.

There were no Reading Comprehension.

## **Section IV - Data Interpretation**

There were 15 questions in Data Interpretation, which included the topics like Mixtures and Alligation, Ratios, Trains, Speed, Time and Distance, Blood Relations, Age, etc. The questions were at moderate difficulty level.

## **Section V - General Knowledge and environmental awareness**

There were total 15 questions in the section. The questions were very direct and required the knowledge from varied sectors. The questions included the topics like UN, UNO, ASEAN, G-15, Inflation, Author of national song etc.
