Detailed Analysis

ENGLISH USAGE AND READING COMPREHENSION

The questions on RC and EU were comparatively difficult from the other parts of the paper. In Reading Comprehension there were five passages and average ten questions were asked on each passage. There were total 48 questions on RC. Most of the questions were direct. In English Usage there were questions on Synonyms, Antonyms, Spelling correction, Analogies, Roots, Phobias, Odd one out and Cloze test were the part of English Usage. There were total 27 questions on English Usage. The breakup of the section is as Follows.

QUANTITATIVE APTITUDE

The *Quantitative Aptitude* section was very easy. There were total 50 questions on QA. The questions were on various topics like Numbers, Percentages, SI & CI, Time, Speed & Distance, Work & Time, Pipes & Cisterns, Ratio & Proportion, Profit & Loss, Mixture, Algebra, Geometry, Mensuration and Set Theory. The detail breakup is as follows

ANALYTICAL AND LOGICAL REASONING

There were total 8 sets of Data Arrangement and overall 40 questions were based on it. Rest of the questions were from Direction Sense, Set Theory, Statement-Assertion etc. The questions were easy. The detail breakup is as follows.
