

JMET Entrance Test

December 12, 2010



We are pleased to present you the analysis of the entrance test for admission to the PGDPM programs offered by the IITs. The test was conducted on the morning of the December 12, 2010 at various centres all over India. Currently seven institutes viz. IIT Bombay, IIT Delhi, IIT Kanpur, IIT Kharagpur, IIT Madras, IIT Roorkee and IISC Banagalore offer admission for programs in Management through this test.

The entrance test paper for this year was easier, as compared to that of last year. The pattern of the paper was already notified to have 120 questions, with four sections and 25% negative marking.

It is clearly mentioned in the JMET website that a student has to clear a minimum cut-off in all the four sections. Ranks will be given only to those students who clear all the sectional cut-offs.

An attempt of around 90 questions, with 85% accuracy, can be categorized as good, while the cut-off for the IIT-B can be expected to be around 78 marks.

The test was divided into four sections of 30 questions each, viz. Verbal Communication, Data Interpretation, Logical Reasoning and Quantitative Ability. There were 120 questions in the test to be solved in a time span of three hours. Students who had appeared and solved the Prac JMETs of PT education, must have found this test very similar.
