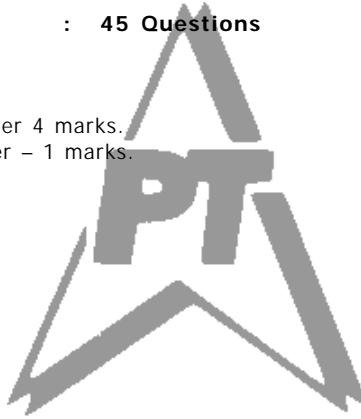
A bird's eye view :

- Duration : 120 minutes; Number of Questions : 175; Total Marks : 700.
- No sectional time limit.
- There were no specific sections available in the test. Maths could be identified as a complete section with 50Q. given together. Apart from this questions from other sections were mixed and presented in a jumbled format.

The complete division of the test was as follows :

Maths	: 50 Questions
Reading Comprehension	: 45 Questions
English Usage	: 30 Questions
General Knowledge	: 5 Questions
DI + LR	: 45 Questions

- The marking scheme:
 - ♦ For each correct answer 4 marks.
 - ♦ For each wrong answer – 1 marks.



Disclaimer: All these questions have been memorised by PT students. We are merely reproducing a few of them here in fragments to ensure that the huge community of students eagerly waiting to see an objective comparison of their performance gets the right picture.

Questions 1 to 50 : Questions number 1 to 50 were based on Quantitative Aptitude. The questions were based on Ratio Proportion, Average etc.

Questions 51 to 95 : Questions number 51 to 95 were based on Reading Comprehension. There were 4 passages were asked the theme and the number of questions of the passages are as follows :

Questions 96 to 125 : Question number 96 to 125 were based on English Usage. There were questions in the EU part were based on Analogies, Fill in the blanks, Idioms and Phrases and Sentence correction.

Analogies : Coward : Craven :: Temerity

Fill in the blanks : There were 10 questions were based on fill in the blanks.

Sentence Correction : There were 5 questions were based on sentence correction.

Idioms and Phrases : There were 10 questions were based on Idioms and Phrases. Idioms like Dropping hat, Wet blanket etc. were asked.

Questions 126 to 130 : There were 5 questions were based on General Knowledge. Questions were based on Nobel prize for Economic, Exxon Mobile, Ministry of Water and Law etc. There was a change in the general awareness questions asked. The data was presented to the student asked to identify the company / industry which represented the data.

Questions 131 to 160 : There were approximately 20 questions were based on Logical Reasoning. There were three sets of information were given (table based), two questions were based set theory and one question is based on Dice related reasoning.

For example: The following table gives the market share in percentage. Which year represents the year 2000 for the Air Lines industry ?

Questions 161 to 175 : Last ten questions were based on Data Interpretation. In DI section there were two set of questions based on given Tables. Each set of questions were consisted of 5 questions in average.

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Overall analysis

The test can be rated as a moderate one. The questions related to Quantitative aptitude were easy and questions of GK were tough remaining topics were average in difficulty level.

Thus, overall we expect that an average score of around 410+ marks should fetch students a call.
